USF CAMPUS TREE COMMITTEE PROMOTES TREE HEALTH

Each year, USF participates in the Tree Campus Higher Education Program, which recognizes green colleges and universities. The program provides a framework to make campuses more livable, healthy, and beautiful, benefiting students and the environment as a whole.

This framework includes five overarching standards that colleges and universities must meet to earn national recognition. These standards are: establishing a campus tree advisory committee, showing a campus tree care plan, verifying dedicated annual expenditures, observing Arbor day, and creating a service-learning project.

To meet the fifth standard, the USF Campus Tree Committee hosted an event on-campus inviting students and community members to learn about trees on-campus and how to take care of them. Certified arborists and student representatives from the Campus Tree Committee were at the event to answer questions and guide clean-up activities such as removing suckers from trunks and Spanish moss from the branches.

Trees are a solution to some of the greatest issues we face. Meeting the standards established by the Tree Campus Higher Education program helps create a campus with a more sustainable environment and is something the USF community can be proud of.
