BUILDING SIGNANGE REFURBISHMENT COMPLETED



The building identification monument in front of OPM is one of 53 monuments that were refurbished with new paint and vinyl lettering.

The refurbishment of all 53 building identification monuments on the Tampa campus has been completed.

The monuments were redone in order to make wayfinding easier and more accessible for pedestrians and drivers, day and night.

The renovations included sandblasting, repainting with vehicle paint for long-lasting effects, and applying new reflective vinyl lettering in a new font. The new font is more legible, and the reflective vinyl will help drivers find buildings when it's dark.

Updating university signage makes the campus look more cohesive and appealing to visitors and the USF community.

The project began in late 2021, and the work was completed by the USF Grounds team, specifically Arthur Elias, Eliezer Ayala, and Lawrence Mentis.
