


A Guide to Stress-Free Parking at USF

1 Properly display your license plate towards the drive aisle while at USF. **“Park Plate Out!”** Back-in and pull-through parking are prohibited. Exceptions are made for disabled parking, EV charging, and those with a front bumper license plate.



2 Ensure your account has the most current and accurate vehicle information.

3 You can register up to three vehicles to your permit, but only one can be parked on campus at a time.



4 Use the Bull Runner® Transit to get around campus. Use the BullTracker® to find buses and projected arrival times <usfbullrunner.com>.

5 Pay attention to all posted signs and barricades.



6 Reserved spaces are exclusive to Reserved Parking permit-holders 24 hours per day, 7 days per week.

7 In support of USF sustainability initiatives, USF provides Electric Vehicle (EV) charging stations as an amenity. Only vehicles actively charging may be parked in these stalls.



8 Heed all warnings! Respond to parking citations promptly to avoid late fees, immobilization, or towing.

9 Visitors are encouraged to utilize ParkMobile or parking pay stations for daily and metered parking spaces to quickly and easily access parking on the Tampa campus. You can also purchase daily parking online through the parking portal.




10 Don't block access to any disabled parking space and don't park in a disabled space without your state disabled permit AND your USF Permit.

12 Don't park in any "No Parking" zones including areas blocking service drives, streets, or fire lanes. It will result in your vehicle being towed.



11 Don't park on the grass or on a sidewalk for any reason.
