SUBJECT: Student Arrested on Charges of Aggravated Assault

Synopsis:

On January 18, 2011 at approximately 11:00 p.m., USF student David Gerald Moseley, 19, of 1957 Key Lime Street in Ocoee, FL, was arrested on the charge of Aggravated Assault with a Deadly Weapon and was transported to the Hillsborough County Central Booking Facilities. His bond was set at \$2000.

The arrest occurred following an investigation into circumstances reported by USF students that Moseley confronted them while displaying a knife in a menacing fashion. According to the victims, the incident occurred at approximately 7:45 p.m. and appears to stem from a minor disagreement that occurred, in class, a short time earlier, during which Moseley reportedly asked a professor to remove a number of students from class for behavior that Moseley believed to be disruptive.

Pursuant to the investigation, officers from the University of South Florida Police Department were able to make contact with Moseley. At the time of his arrest Moseley was still in possession of a cutlery knife bearing a four-inch blade.
