Obituaries

Dr. Julie Harmon (Professor) died January 27th

"She had been battling some non-COVID health issues for some time, and in fact had been in the hospital, but sadly was unable to return home, "said Dr **Jim Leahy.**

She joined the Chemistry faculty in December 1993 as an assistant professor and was promoted to full professor in June 2006.

She and her husband served as gracious hosts to faculty/staff gatherings in their home for a number of years. Trained as a physical chemist, she undertook teaching biochemistry as well as polymer chemistry to satisfy an unmet need.

In addition to her husband, she is survived by numerous cousins, nieces, and nephews. Internment was at Calvary Cemetery, Erie, PA

Barbara B. Martin died February 7th.

She was the mother of a daughter and five sons. After the youngest was able to attend nursery school, she returned to doing non-paid professional activities at the Chemistry Department (1973-2006) She served as Co Editor of *Florida Scientist* for 26 years. She collaborated with her husband in chemistry research contributions to over 70 publications and six books. She received the "Alumni Award" of Grinnell College, the highest award of its Alumni Association (1981). She was also a recipient of the "Florida Award" the highest award of the Florida Academy of Sciences (1994) She and her husband were responsible for creation of ten funds or endowments at USF, including one that provides chemistry graduate students with travel awards.

University Achievements

Dr Steve Currall is President and Professor of USF



Dr. Currall

Dr. Currall has been faced with managing responses to change as consequence of Covid impacts, most notably a singular reduction in the University budget. There is a notable need to obtain reductions in budget without adversely affecting current employment.

Fewer persons have come to Florida, and this has impacted State revenues, and university budgets. USF administrators have been faced with a range of necessary decisions at all levels.

One example was the decision to terminate the College of Education undergraduate teachers' program, owing to the few number of graduates in recent years.

After a public announcement, school superintendents noted publicly how valuable the graduates of the program have been and urged reconsideration. The program will be shifted to the St. Petersburg campus. A search committee for a new dean was named.

USF Innovation Enterprise

Paul R. Sanberg, M.D., Ph.D., D.Sc., is Senior VP for Research, Innovation & Knowledge Enterprise.

He is also President and Founder of the National Academy of Inventors.

In January Dr. Sanberg was named a 2021 IEEE Fellow. He was cited for "contributions to stem cell therapies for neurodegenerative conditions."

Dr. Sanberg is also a highly cited author. He is one of 146 at USF who are among the top 1.5% of all cited scientists in the world.
