Honors Program

The Honors Program in Communication provides an opportunity for exceptional undergraduate students in Communication to work closely with a faculty member in an intensive research experience.

Guidelines for Application:


- Application to the program ordinarily occurs during the second semester of the junior year or prior to completion of 90 semester hours.
- Admission to the program is based on your overall academic record, performance in Communication courses and faculty recommendations.
- To be admitted to the program, you should have at least a 3.5 GPA in all Communication courses and a 3.0 cumulative GPA.

Requirements for Completion:

- Choose a faculty advisor who will work with you.
- Register for 3 hours of Honors Reading (SPC 4903) and 3 hours of Honors Thesis (SPC 4970) in consecutive semesters.
- SPC 4903 and SPC 4970 are included in the 36 credit hours for the major and may count as either departmental electives or courses in your area of concentration.
- While taking Honors Reading, submit a thesis proposal to your faculty advisor and choose a Communication faculty member to serve as an outside reader.
- In the Honors Thesis semester, you must complete and defend your undergraduate thesis to graduate with honors.
