Course Developed

MDST 3040: Democratic Politics in the New Media Environment (2021 Spring/ Fall)

This 3 units advanced level course is prepared for the Department of Media Studies at the University of Virginia. This course studies the nature of digital media and its use by diverse political entities in the current and recent political environment. Students critically analyze the ways in which new media theorists and socio-political scientists have investigated the connection between media and politics, the methods they have applied, and the validity of their findings and approaches in the constantly changing media system. Students examine the relationships between media and political dynamics in the United States and other nations across the globe.

MDST 3559: Data Journalism and Social Media (2022 Spring)

This course is an introduction to the fundamentals of data journalism centering on social media – identifying and getting primary and secondary sources, quantitatively and qualitatively analyzing datasets, summarizing facts and opinions, and fact checking. By working as a class step-by-step throughout the semester, students will learn a social media research methodology and online network structure that they can use as a foundation for data journalist.

MMC 4936/ 6936: Telling Stories with Data (2023 Summer)

A well-designed data visualization can communicate sophisticated ideas with clarity and precision. In this course, I cover effective principles of creating well-designed data visualizations and discuss different ways of utilizing data to tell compelling stories. The course reviews various objectives of infographics and how they are structured for different audiences and purposes, such as education, marketing, and persuasion. The students explore infographic and data visualization programs, such as Venngage and Tableau. Moreover, students exercise how to gather and visualize data to tell engaging stories. They utilize Venngage to design captivating infographics and Tableau to analyze data, create interactive maps, and build dashboards composed of interconnected visualizations.
