Title: Kant's Just War Theory

Defended: 3/31/16

Description: The traditional secular just war theory presented by Hugo Grotius establishes a tradition, into which Kant's interpretation of the relationship between justice and war does not fit. Initially, Brian Orend offers a traditional interpretation of Kant, which fails to sufficiently refute the notion that Kant fundamentally disagrees with the just war tradition. Next, Howard Williams offers a critique of the claim that Kant had a just war theory at all, leading to a conclusion contrary to other Kantian positions. Transitioning from a negative to positive argument, Kant's general approach to philosophical inquiry is demonstrated as dynamic and progressive, indicating a new Kantian approach to just war theory. To better illustrate Kant's philosophical approach to war, a Communist just war theory is utilized to demonstrate a new class of just war theory, i.e. universal just war theory. Finally, an explication of Kant's universal just war theory is offered and applied to Operation Iraqi Freedom, demonstrating its utility and clarifying its methodology.
