Over the last 50 years Germany has become a prime destination for immigrants. This development has had a significant impact on German culture and society. In this course, students will **study the diverse cultural expressions of migrants, immigrants, and their descendants**. These residents and citizens are part of today's Germany but may still face xenophobia and racism.

Students will analyze literary and non-literary texts, films and other visual media, popular culture, and contextualize these expressions in relation to questions of national, ethnic, religious, linguistic, and gender identity.

The language of instruction will be German; discussions, readings, and assignments will be in the target language. The course objectives are to improve students' written and oral communication skills in German, as well as enhance students' ability to critically analyze contemporary and historical culture and discourse.



Pre-requisite: German III or equivalent.
