## What will I be studying?

The department of Religious Studies examines the history and contemporary form of those human activities labeled religious. We consider not only those social forms widely recognized as religions – such as Christianity, Judaism, Islam, and Hinduism – but also those that test the boundaries of that category in interesting ways – such as Voodoo, ecological movements, and democracy. Students are encouraged to question the implications of labeling certain social forms or human behaviors religious.

Choosing to pursue Religious Studies as your major opens a wide range of possibilities for you to customize your degree plan to pursue other programs of study that align with your personal goals and career plans. Students majoring in Religious Studies typically have the freedom to pair their major curriculum with additional curricular or co-curricular work, such as the pursuit of preprofessional program requirements (e.g., medical or graduate school), up to two minors, a second major, and/or a concurrent baccalaureate degree, all within their expected 8-semester graduation timeframe. The sample four-year plan on this flyer demonstrates the potential room you might have by using your general electives for this purpose. Specific eligibility will depend on your overall academic progress and degree plan, so consult with your major academic advisor for more information!
