Choosing to pursue World Languages & Cultures as your major opens a wide range of possibilities for you to customize your degree plan to pursue other programs of study that align with your personal goals and career plans. Students in this major typically have the freedom to pair their major curriculum with additional curricular or co-curricular work, such as the pursuit of preprofessional program requirements (e.g., medical or graduate school), up to two minors, a second major, and/or a concurrent baccalaureate degree, all within their expected 8-semester graduation timeframe. Specific eligibility will depend on your overall academic progress and degree plan, so consult with your major academic advisor for more information!
