This statement outlines the nature of Jericho Road Ministries/Jericho Road Community Health Center (JRCHC) in Buffalo, NY, and the Adama Martha Memorial Community Health Center (AMMCHC) in Kono District of Sierra Leone participation as sub-contractor on the proposed NIH grant submission titled: "The Nurse Champion Model for Sickle Cell Disease Early Diagnosis and Care Access" for which Dr. Cheedy Jaja, associate professor at the University of South Carolina, Columbia is the principal investigator.

Jericho Road in Buffalo is a Federally Qualified Community Health Center committed to providing excellent primary medical care to the most vulnerable domestically and internationally. At the AMMCHC, the proposed site for the research study, 50-75 patients are seen daily, and babies are delivered safely. The AMMCHC has a functional surgery center for C-sections and hernia repairs. The AMMCHC also has a staff of 50 dedicated people, all of whom are Sierra Leoneans. In addition, AMMCHC provides mobile medical clinic services to 6 surrounding villages regularly.

To ensure the successful implementation of the proposed research study, Jericho Road Community Health Center and the AMMCHC as sub-contractors on the grant proposal are committing to do the following:

- Administer all personnel, payroll, and human resource functions for the project's clinical and research team on the ground in Kono District and Freetown.
- Administer all purchasing of equipment, supplies, and services needed for the project's research and clinical team in Sierra Leone as specified on the sub-contract.
- Provide physical space at AMMCHC as a research site for the project.
- Oversee rental payments for use of physical space in Freetown as a research study site.
- Administer other project-related logistics as indicated on the sub-contract, including but not limited to overseeing payments for transportation services within Sierra Leone.

Task 1: Study Co-Investigator #1: (Dr. Joseph Edem-Hotah)

The Contractor shall collaborate with Dr. Cheedy Jaja to administer payroll and human resource functions related to the roles and responsibilities of the study co-investigator (#1). The study co-investigator (#1) shall perform the roles defined in the study protocol for the duration of the study. The study co-investigator shall receive \$7,000 in remuneration in Year 2, and \$7,000 in Year 3. Total cost is \$14,000.

Task 2: Study Co-Investigator #2: (Dr. Joan Shepherd)

The Contractor shall collaborate with Dr. Cheedy Jaja to administer payroll and human resource functions related to the roles and responsibilities of the study co-investigator (#2). The study co-investigator (#2) shall perform the roles defined in the study protocol for the duration of the study. The study co-investigator shall receive \$7,000 in remuneration in Year 2, and \$7,000 in Year 3. Total cost is \$14,000.

Task 3: Research Registered Nurse (#1)

The Contractor shall collaborate with Dr. Cheedy Jaja to hire, and administer payroll and human resource functions related to the roles and responsibilities of the registered research nurse (#1). The study registered research nurse (#2) shall perform the roles defined in the study protocol for the registered research nurse. The study registered research nurse will be hired for the duration of the research study (two years). The registered nurse will perform a 20-hour week as defined by the labor laws of Sierra Leone. The study registered research nurse shall receive \$5,000 in remuneration in Year 2, and \$5,000 in Year 3. Total cost is \$10,000.

Task 4: Research Registered Nurse (#2)

The Contractor shall collaborate with Dr. Cheedy Jaja to hire and administer payroll and human resource functions related to the roles and responsibilities of the registered research nurse (#2). The study registered research nurse (#2) shall perform the roles defined in the study protocol for the registered research nurse. The study registered research nurse will be hired for the duration of the research study (two years). The registered research nurse will perform a 20-hour week as defined by the labor laws of Sierra Leone. The study registered research nurse shall receive \$5,000 in remuneration in Year 2, and \$5,000 in Year 3. Total cost is \$10,000.

Task 5: Nurse Genetic Counselor

The registered nurse/Genetics Counselor shall collaborate with Dr. Cheedy Jaja to perform tasks related to the study as specified in the study protocol. The registered nurse/genetics counselor will take direction from the PI with regards to study organization and implementation. The registered nurse/Genetics Counselor will be hired for the duration of the research study (two years). The registered nurse/Genetics Counselor will perform a 20-hour week as defined by the labor laws of Sierra Leone. The nurse genetic counselor shall receive \$5,000 in remuneration in Year 2, and \$5,000 in Year 3. Total cost is \$10,000.

Task 6. Research Study Database Manager

The Contractor shall collaborate with Dr. Cheedy Jaja to hire and administer payroll and human resource functions related to the roles and responsibilities of the study database manager. The study database manager shall perform the roles defined in the study protocol for the study database manager. The study database manager will be hired for the duration of the research study (two years). The study database manager will perform a 20-hour week as defined by the labor laws of Sierra Leone. The study database manager shall receive \$4,000 in remuneration in Year 2, and \$4,000 in Year 3. Total cost is \$10,000.

Task 7: Community liaison worker

The Contractor shall collaborate with Dr. Cheedy Jaja to hire and administer payroll and human resource functions related to the roles and responsibilities of the study community liaison worker. The study community liaison worker shall perform the roles defined in the study protocol for the study community health worker. The study community liaison worker will be hired for the duration of the research study (two years). The study community liaison worker will perform a 20-hour week as defined by the labor laws of Sierra Leone. The study community liaison worker shall receive \$3,800 remuneration in Year 2, and \$3,800 in Year 3. Total cost is \$7,600.

Task 8: Administration of Government of Sierra Leone Wage Tariff (NASSIT charge)

The contractor shall administer the Government of Sierra Leone Wage tariff for applicable wages. The amount of the tariff at 4% of projected contractor staff wage (\$36,800 x 4%) is \$1,472 in Year 2, and \$1,472 in Year 3. The total cost is \$2,944.

Task 9: Research space rental

The Contractor agrees to provide physical space at AMMCHC as the site for the project team to carry out its work at a fair price rent of \$5,000 annually for two years. \$5,000 will be paid to the contractor in Year 2, and \$5,000 in Year 3. The rent will cover all utilities including international telephone connection, wireless, and internet access. Total cost is \$10,000.

Task 10: Research space rental Payments (Freetown)

The Contractor agrees to collaborate with Dr. Jaja to secure a physical space in Freetown as a second site for the project team to conduct its work at a fair rent of \$3,000 annually for two years. The rent will cover all utilities including international telephone connection, wireless, and internet access. Total cost is \$6,000.

Task 11: Transportation: Project vehicle

The Contractor agrees to collaborate with Dr. Jaja to facilitate the rental of a suitable vehicle (4x4) for use by the research staff for research-related transportation services for \$7,500 annually for a total cost of \$15,000 for the study duration. The contractor shall collaborate with Dr. Jaja to ensure that the vehicle is appropriately licensed with insurance and liability coverage as required by the appropriate laws of Sierra Leone.

Reporting Requirements/Schedule

The contractor shall coordinate regular telephone conference calls and/or on-site meetings to plan and discuss the implementation of the above tasks and to facilitate the completion of tasks specified in this contract. Within one month of the contract award, the contractor and Dr.Jaja will develop a reporting requirement schedule. Thereafter, bi-weekly to monthly conference calls shall be arranged between the Contractor and Dr. Jaja to ensure smooth implementation of tasks.

Period of Performance/Delivery Schedule

The period of performance is three years. Within one month of the contract award, the contractor and Dr. Jaja will develop a task delivery schedule. Thereafter, bi-weekly to monthly conference calls shall be arranged between the Contractor and Dr. Jaja to ensure smooth delivery of tasks.

Task Payment Schedule: Fixed Price

Within one month of the contract award, the contractor and Dr. Jaja will develop a service and task payment schedule.


