# Making a Gift to the College of Behavioral and Community Sciences

### Scholarships, Awards, and Program Support

Contributions to the College of Behavioral and Community Sciences (CBCS) may be directed specifically to academic and need based scholarships, to fund any one of the College's programs or departments, or to begin a new initiative that is aligned with the goals and priorities of CBCS. As a donor it is important for you to know that your contribution can be put straight to work serving your intended purpose, or it can be held as an endowment so that it grows in perpetuity.

### Annual vs. Endowed Opportunities

An *annual contribution* is an easy way to get involved. With an annual contribution, the entire amount of your gift is directed to support the purpose for which the funds have been given (e.g., annual scholarships, annual award, to assist a specific program). These gifts are made with the intention of being spent either immediately or over a short period of time. To create a named annual scholarship or award requires a commitment of \$1,000 or more per year for five years.

An *endowed fund* is a fund that is created with a contribution that becomes permanently restricted for the specific purpose designated by the donor. These gifts, which can be given over five years, are held in perpetuity and invested, and only a portion of the interest earned is distributed each year for the purpose of the gift. A gift of \$25,000 or more will establish a named endowed scholarship fund that will continue to grow and support students in perpetuity. In order to create a larger endowment on which to draw on in the future, , some donors choose to create an endowment using a combination of vehicles to accomplish the intent of their gift . One of the most popular ways to do this is to make an outright gift to CBCS now (e.g., cash, stock), followed by a planned gift through a will or with a distribution from a retirement plan or life insurance policy.
