- Skill Level B − You have some experience with the course topic. You know how to use your computer, smartphone or tablet and want to expand basic knowledge or fill in some gaps. Courses assume basic topic knowledge and experience.
- Skill Level C You are familiar with and comfortable navigating this course topic. You have mastered the basics: now you want to go further. Not for beginners! Classes assume a solid background and prior experience with the topic.

The Resonance and Residue of the First African-American Press, *Freedom's Journal*

In 1827 Freedom's Journal printed the first African-American newspaper, giving Black voices a powerful platform at a time when they were often silenced. More than just news, it provided a parallel narrative to the white press, preserving the real stories of African-American life—stories that would have been lost without it—while challenging injustice and paving the way for future Black publications to fight for equality and civil rights.


