Fit vs Fidelity: Health Program Evaluation in a Foreign Country

Samuel Matos, M.D., MPH

This presentation will discuss the challenges and opportunities encountered during the implementation and process evaluation of a US-developed heart health prevention program in a Latin American country. While the program was designed for and proven effective among Latino populations in the US, a number of potential crosscultural constraints were anticipated and dealt with during the educational intervention. Application of cultural competency constructs was especially valuable in this regard with the intent of adapting the program to local community conditions while still preserving its original essence and meaning. Role of evaluators in successfully navigating such cross-cultural nuances will be highlighted.
