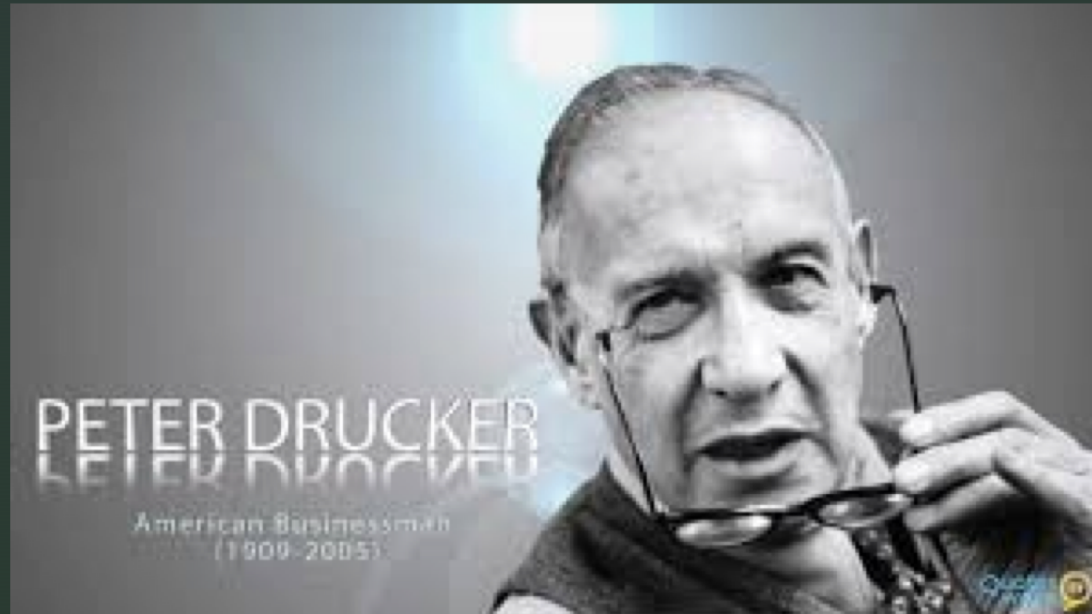

Chief Data Officers (CDO) oversee the collection, management, and storage of data throughout an organization. They are responsible for analyzing and deriving insights from data to make strategic decisions. They form a part of a company's executive team.

CDO are champions for global data management, governance, quality, and vendor relationships across the enterprise. They oversee the enterprise information management (EIM) program, data scientists and data stewards, and data service providers.

The Difference Between **Effectiveness** And **Efficiency**

Effective (adj.) – *Adequate to accomplish a purpose; producing the intended or expected result.*

Efficient (adj.) – *Performing or functioning in the best possible manner with the least waste of time and effort.*

The difference between effectiveness and efficiency can be summed up shortly, sweetly and succinctly – Being **effective** is about **doing the right things**, while being **efficient** is about **doing things right**.

The Strategy

Focus on your audience's needs!

- **What** questions are we trying to answer with the data?
- **Who** is the audience for the data?
- **How** are the data intended to be used?



The Story

Elevate your message!

- **What** is the story we can tell with the data?
- **What is** the story behind the story?
- **How** can we use the data to build a powerful narrative?



The Policy

Evaluate the impact!

- **What** documented impact is supported by the data?
- **Is there** a policy in place informed by the data?
- **Is there** a need for a policy as suggested by the data?
