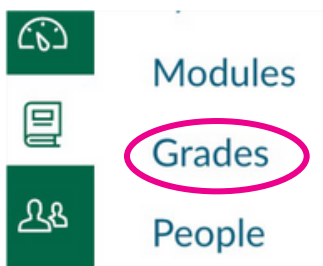
## *The Difference Between Comments and Annotations*

Instructors often report that students encounter challenges to finding feedback on Canvas assignments. Sharing feedback is an essential part to maintaining a positive learner/instructor experience. Below are the steps to finding comments and annotations on graded assignments.

### Finding Comments

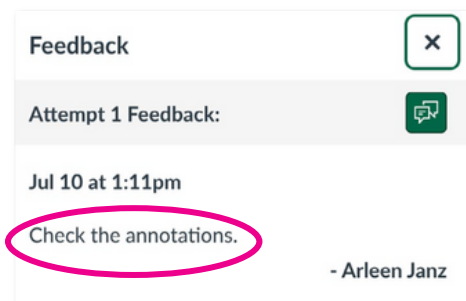
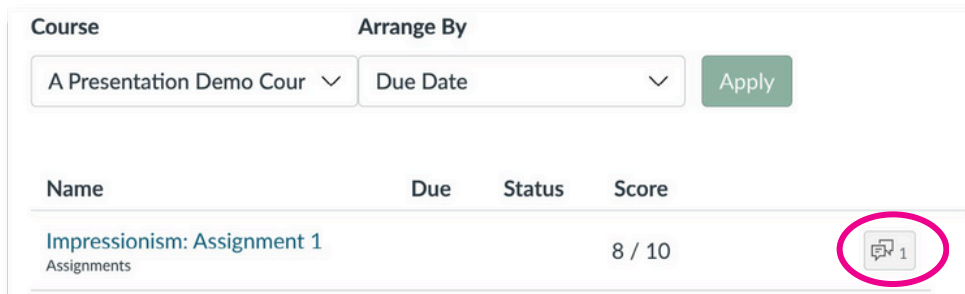

Go to the **Grades** section of the course navigation menu.

If a comment has been posted to your assignment, a small discussion icon will appear to the right of your assignment with a number indicating how many comments exist. Select the **discussion icon** and the comments panel will open to view the details.

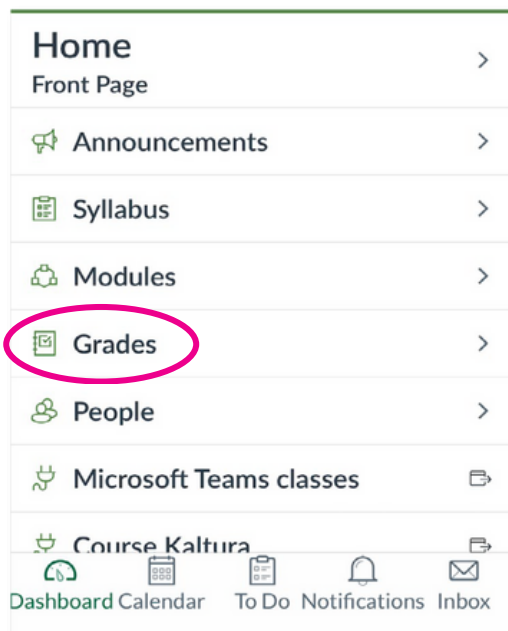

The student experience will vary if they are accessing assignments and feedback through the Canvas App on a mobile device. Below are the steps to finding feedback on an Apple device.

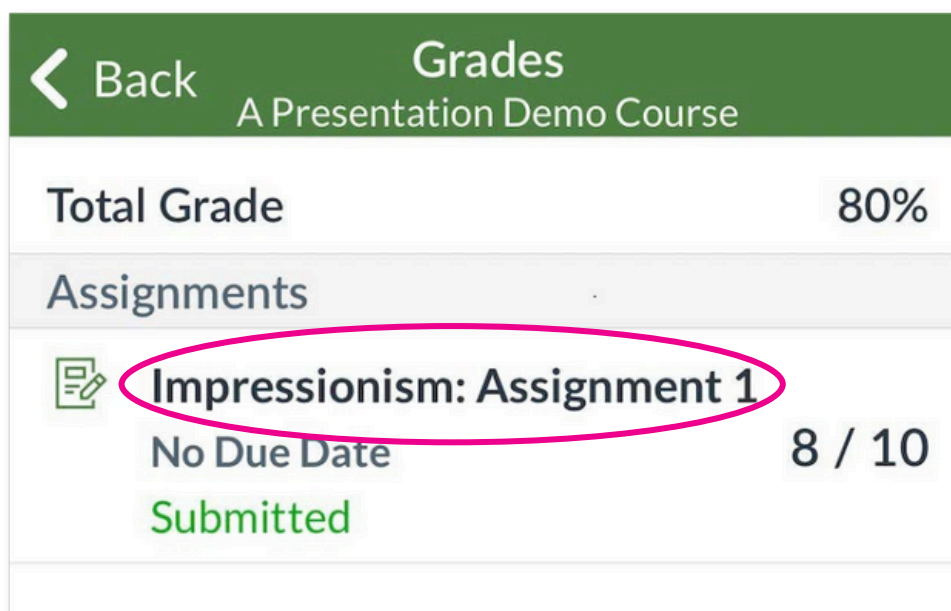

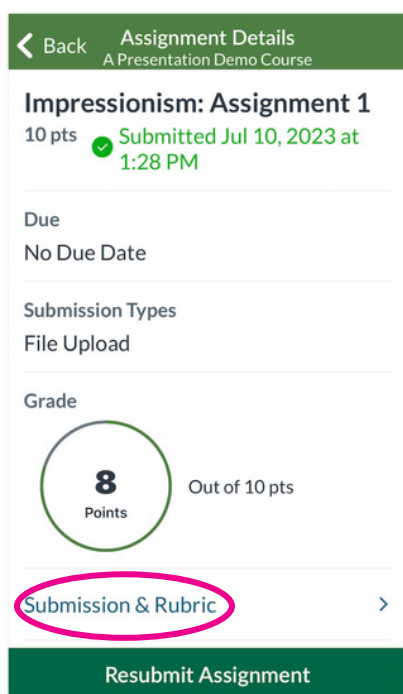
