

The USF Board of Trustees is responsible for cost-effective policy decisions appropriate to the system mission and the implementation and maintenance of high-quality education programs within the laws and rules of the state. Campus Boards for USF St. Petersburg and USF Sarasota-Manatee are appointed by the USF Board of Trustees. The USF Board of Trustees was created in 2001 by the Florida legislature.

The 13 trustees include distinguished figures in accounting, banking, business, education, healthcare, law, technology, philanthropy and public policy leadership. Six trustees are appointed by Florida's governor, and five trustees are appointed by the Florida Board of Governors. The USF System Faculty Council President and USF System Student Advisory Council President also serve as trustees. The USF System President serves as Corporate Secretary.


USF SYSTEM STUDENTS

- The University of South Florida System is home to a student body of nearly 50,000 students representing over 130 different countries.
- The USF System was home to 50 national scholarship and fellowship student awardees during the 2015-16 academic year including Boren, Fulbright, Gilman, and Goldwater.
- The Morsani College of Medicine brought in its strongest cohort to date, with an average MCAT score of 34, placing it in the top quintile of all medical schools in the country.
- USF Tampa's Fall 2016 freshman academic profile posts an average SAT score of 1226 and a high school GPA of 4.08, which exceeds the Florida Board of Governors Preeminence benchmarks.
- USF Tampa is a recognized "Top Producer" of Peace Corps Volunteers. Ranking 16th in the Nation (among universities larger than 15K students) for Peace Corps Volunteers in 2016.
- *U.S. News and World Report* ranked USF Tampa as a Best College for Veterans (2016).
- USF Tampa is ranked 46th among public universities for social mobility, research and civic engagement, according to *Washington Monthly* (2016).

- USF Tampa ranks among the top tier of colleges listed in the *U.S. News and World Report Best Colleges 2016*, ranking in the top 100 of best public national universities.
- According to the *Academic Ranking of World Universities (ARWU)* (2015), USF Tampa ranks among the top 300 of the best colleges and universities in the world.
- USF Tampa graduate level programs continue to be ranked among the best according to the 2017 *U.S. News and World Report Graduate School Rankings*. USF graduate programs in the top 50 include: Industrial and Organizational Psychology (#4), Public Health (#16), Audiology (#17), Criminology (#22), Library and Information Studies (#24), Rehabilitation Counseling (#24), Nursing (#40), Industrial/Manufacturing Engineering (#46), and Clinical Psychology (#50).


