## GREETINGS FROM THE DIRECTOR

### Salutations from the SSS team!



Our Student Support Services (SSS) team remains focused on student success as we navigated significant program changes this academic year. After the retirement of our long-time Director, I have been appointed as the new SSS Director. I am grateful to Dean Allison Crume and Assistant Dean Tony Delgado of Undergraduate Studies for the strong support they have provided to SSS during this transition period. I am excited to lead the program through this new chapter of our 35+ year history at USF. I also appreciate the outpouring of support I received from partners and colleagues across campus as I stepped into my new role. I am deeply committed to ensuring the continued success of SSS students as we meet our grant funded objectives and contribute to the strategic mission of USF. Toward that end, I am happy to share that we have exceeded our funding objectives in our most recent Annual Performance Report (APR) submitted to our funding source, the U.S. Department of Education. For the 2020-2021 academic year, data from the APR show SSS achieved a 97% persistence rate and a 97% good academic standing rate among served students. SSS also achieved a retention rate of 92% for the summer 2021 cohort of students. We are especially proud to have achieved these outcomes during the Covid-19 pandemic when students were facing unprecedented challenges personally and academically. The SSS team was also personally affected by the pandemic and we have a renewed focus on personal and professional wellness to ensure we can continue helping students succeed at USF. In addition, new SSS initiatives began this year – including the SSS Open House for current students to visit our office to network with their peers and connect with SSS staff and the SSS Connects Live sessions held on MS Teams for newly admitted students to learn more about our program. In partnership with the ACE team, SSS also debuted a new SSS Canvas page to help newly admitted students complete their onboarding requirements to enroll at USF. These new initiatives highlight the innovative approach to student success that SSS continues to model in the constantly evolving world of higher education. I am thrilled to share stories of student success and program updates throughout this newsletter. Thank you to our campus partners who also help support the success of SSS students. We look forward to welcoming our newest class of SSS students this summer and helping them develop a sense of belonging at USF. With your help I know we can continue to build on our legacy of inclusiveness by ensuring all students reach their personal, academic, and career goals. As you read our newsletter, I invite you to join SSS in celebrating student success – GO BULLS!

# Student Spotlight: Michkayla Dandreano

**Michkayla Dandreano** is a Florida native who lived in Ocala, Florida prior to enrolling at USF. She has been a participant in the Student Support Services TriO program since arriving on campus in 2018. Michkayla is a graduating senior majoring in Elementary Education with plans to become a primary grade Teacher in the Tampa Bay area after graduation. She aspires to work with and make a difference in the lives of low-income disadvantaged children. In addition to educating students, her goal is to help improve the mental health of students and to help teachers prioritize their well-being too. Michkayla is passionate about education, and she also has plans to become certified in Social Studies to teach middle and high school students.

Michkayla chose to attend USF because she believed the university – through the SSS program – offered the best opportunity for continuing her education. Michkayla notes, “I have had a multitude of challenges since becoming a student at USF which range from family deaths, leaving an abusive relationship and struggling with my own mental health. SSS has done so much for me, and I cannot begin to describe how thankful I am for my Tampa family! Starting college was extremely difficult – first time away from family, first generation, leaving my entire support system and moving to a completely new place on my own. SSS helped me find resources and consoled me during everything I went through.” During her time at USF,

Michkayla went on to not only move past these personal challenges but she has also thrived academically by making the Dean’s List multiple times!

Michkayla is an outstanding student who currently works in the SSS office as the Summer Program Coordinator and served as an SSS Peer Coach in the summer of 2021. In both roles, Michkayla has been a valuable member of the SSS team by helping new students navigate the admissions process and successfully transition into USF. Michkayla shares, “In October 2019, I began working for SSS and have helped others like myself follow their dream. Through my job I met two of my closest friends who I truly admire and they never fail to put a smile on my face or make me laugh. During the Summer of 2021, I became a Peer Coach and was able to introduce my second set of students to the place I have called home since Summer 2018. Throughout all of this they have helped me become a stronger, more confident woman.”

Michkayla was selected as Miss SSS for the 2019-2020 academic year because she exemplified the SSS spirit – hardworking, resilient, service oriented, and committed to SSS. When asked how SSS has helped her to achieve success Michkayla replied, “I would not have made the friendships that have helped me to better myself, would not be where I am today without the support granted to me, and would not have the family that I have gained since moving to Tampa in 2018. Without USF or SSS, I would not be in college today!”

# Community Engagement to Promote Student Success

SSS collaborated with the United Negro College Fund who hosted an event for high school students titled, *“Get That Money: Practical Tips for Securing Scholarships”*. According to Jude, “For this event we were granted the opportunity to speak to middle and high school students. 
